

SUMMER STUDENTSHIP GUIDELINES

<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of this award is to support undergraduate students to engage in research aimed at improving child, youth, maternal or women's health at the IWK.

ELIGIBILITY: The applicant must be a student who is enrolled in an undergraduate program at the time of application submission (all undergraduate programs are eligible) and identifies an established IWK researcher to officiate as their supervisor. An IWK researcher is defined as i) holding a current IWK MDSAS or staff position and ii) having primary research lab or primary clinical office at the IWK or conducts research at the IWK.

Summer students funded through the Research in Medicine (RIM) program are ineligible to apply.

TERMS OF SUPPORT: \$5,000 for 12 weeks including 2 weeks for vacation

- Supervisors may only submit one application per competition. The application must be for a single project and the research must occur predominately at the IWK.
- A student cannot be a paid employee while holding an IWK Studentship. If the student is a paid
 employee they must be terminated or placed on leave from the paid position before the award can be
 accepted.
- If REB approval is pending, activities that support the study but are not dependent/do not require REB approval can be undertaken, e.g. establish mechanisms for data collection, creating manuals, identifying learning needs, etc. Once ethics is approved, a confirmation of the REB approval must be provided to Research & Innovation Advancement (RIA).
- Recipients are not permitted to hold summer salary award funding in excess of \$5,000/year. If the recipient has received funds from another source totalling less than \$5,000, they may request, in writing to RIA, that the IWK Studentship be used as a top up to a maximum of \$5,000.
- A <u>final report</u> is due October 15th of the year of the award.
- Recipients must agree to follow any stipulations set by IWK policies and/or procedures (e.g. travel, IP, procurement) and any other applicable guidelines.

<u>APPLICATION PROCESS:</u> Applications must be submitted online through the ROMEO Researcher Portal by the student as Principal Investigator. The ROMEO Researcher Portal and registration instructions can be found on the <u>IWK Research Funding Opportunities webpage</u>. (**NOTE**: Project Sponsor Information tab does not need to be completed). The application will be adjudicated by the Scientific Review Committee.
